Community Litter Pick - Thank You and How You Can Help

Today, our Eco-Ambassadors and Junior Travel Ambassadors worked with Harrow Litter Pickers and parent volunteers to clean part of the South Harrow Arches.

This is a route many of our children and families use every day to walk to school, travel to work, or go to the shops. Sadly, it is often very dirty, with lots of litter and fly-tipping. This can make the area look unpleasant and can also be unsafe.

The land under the arches belongs to Transport for London (TfL). For many years, only volunteers cleaned this area. After a lot of hard work and pressure from Harrow Litter Pickers, TfL now cleans it twice a month. However, this is still not enough, and rubbish quickly builds up again.



Harrow Litter Pickers are working with:

- Harrow Council
- Transport for London (TfL)
- The Police
- The Fire Service

They are asking for more regular cleaning and better ways to report litter and fly-tipping.

Looking after our local area is everyone's responsibility. Children learn best when they see adults setting a good example.

You can help by:

- Talking to your child about keeping streets clean
- Never littering or fly-tipping
- Supporting them with their letter or drawing
