Year 4 Visit to the Headstone Manor Museum

Last Friday, year 4 had the opportunity to visit the Headstone Manor and Museum. Children are currently learning all about the invasion of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. in History and this was a great way to enrich their learning.

I enjoyed the bit in the 'office' room because it shared information, a source (letter) and pictures of a recent event about a hole in the road close to Pinner School, which was quite recent that had led to the mines in olden Harrow.

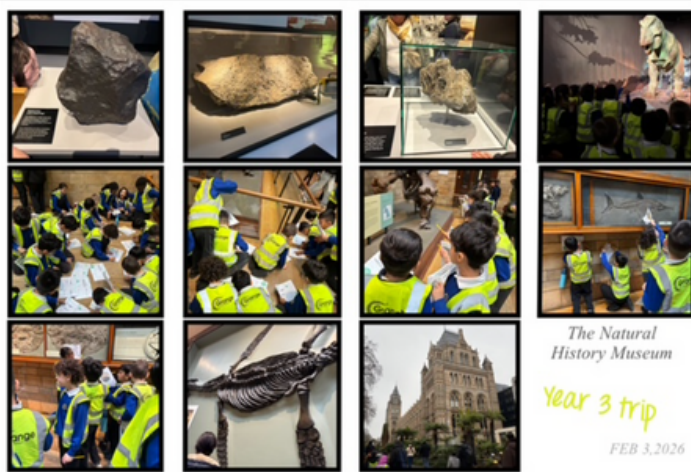


Year 3 Visit to the Natural History Museum

On Tuesday 3 February, Year 3 pupils visited the Natural History Museum as part of their science learning on rocks and fossils.

The children explored the dinosaur and fossil galleries, learning how fossils are formed and finding out more about the work of Mary Anning. They also visited the volcanoes section, where they examined different volcanic rocks, learned about how volcanoes erupt, explored the structure of the Earth and experienced an earthquake simulation.

It was fantastic to see how much the children remembered from their classroom learning. They were curious, excited and highly engaged, confidently naming dinosaurs and making clear links to their science topics. The pupils were exceptionally well behaved throughout the visit and represented the school brilliantly.

We were lucky enough to have some Elders join us and we also had many other family members join us in the hall for a wonderful afternoon.

It was fantastic to see so many children share their Elder's stories with the room. We are grateful to have opportunities like these, developing relationships and confidence in story telling.
