Arbor Parent Registration Reminder



Year 3 trip to Headstone Manor Roman Workshop

Year 3 had an exciting trip to Headstone Manor Museum and Harrow Heritage Museum to learn more about the Romans. The children travelled by bus and explored the Manor House, the small barn and the museum.

During the Roman workshop, the children handled real Roman artefacts that were nearly 2,000 years old. They enjoyed learning about how Romans lived, the roads they built and the objects they used in everyday life. Many pupils were fascinated by the ancient clay pots, Roman artefacts and excavation activities.

The children especially enjoyed taking part in the archaeology activity, where they searched through sand to discover hidden artefacts, just like real archaeologists. They also explored the museum and spotted many interesting Roman objects and historical items.

Iman said, "I was excited because I touched a Roman pot from 2,000 years ago."

Hadi said, "My favourite part was digging in the sand to find Roman artefacts."

Leen said, "I enjoyed learning about the Romans and looking around the museum."

Joshua said, "I found it interesting when we touched the ancient artefacts."

The trip helped the children bring their History learning to life and gave them a memorable experience of Roman Britain.

The morning was followed by a whole-school assembly where children learned about the importance of active travel and were introduced to our exciting comic strip competition. Throughout the week, pupils also took part in a travel survey to see which class had the highest number of children walking, cycling or scooting to school.



Our walking buses continued throughout the week, with Tuesday's route beginning from McDonald's and Wednesday's from the Beacon Centre. Thank you to all the parents and families who supported this initiative. Walking alongside the children created a lovely sense of community spirit and encouraged positive conversations about healthy and safe travel.

On Wednesday, children in Years 1 and 2 had the opportunity to work with our Year 6 Student Leaders during the "Brighten Your Bag" workshop. Pupils designed and decorated their own bags using bright colours and creative patterns to help promote road safety and visibility. The children showed incredible focus, creativity and enthusiasm, and it was wonderful to see so much talent on display.





On Thursday morning, our Student Leaders proudly hosted the Active Travel for Life coffee morning for parents. The children confidently presented information about the importance of active travel, shared ways parents can support sustainable journeys to school and discussed the positive impact active travel has on health, wellbeing and the environment. We were pleased to see such a good turnout and really appreciated the positive feedback from parents.

Later that afternoon, children brought in their bikes and scooters and took part in allocated riding sessions in the playground. The sessions were full of excitement and gave pupils a chance to practise riding safely while enjoying being active with their friends.

Overall, Walk to School Week was a huge success. It was fantastic to see so many children walking, cycling and scooting to school while promoting healthy lifestyles, road safety and community spirit across the school.
