YEAR 6 CURRICULUM

English: Guided reading, spelling, grammar and punctuation and writing.

Maths: Place value, number and operations, fractions, decimals, percentages, algebra, ratio, statistics, geometry and measure.

Science: Living things and their habitats, electricity, light, the circulatory system, variation, fossils.

History: World War II, Colonialism, Ancient Greeks.

Geography: Mountains, Natural Disasters (tsunamis and hurricanes), Greece.

Art & D.T.: Drawing, textiles, electrical systems, sculpture.

Music: String instrument – violin.

P.E.: Coordination; dynamic and static balance; agility and dance.

PSHE: Being me, healthy living, celebrating difference, relationships, SRE.

Computing: Online safety, coding, spreadsheets, databases, 3D modelling, Word processing

Religious Education: Islam, Christianity, Sanatana Dharma, Sikh Dharm, Humanism, Judaism, Zoroastrianism.

Spanish: All about me, celebrations, food and drink, the weather.

ENGLISH

Reading

- In-school and at home.
- Reading books to be sent home weekly and returned and swapped a week later.
- Reading diaries to be checked on Mondays every week.


Spelling

Writing


- Writing to entertain.

HOME LEARNING

- All work will be set on our Google Classroom – to be completed on paper in Home Learning books.
- Set on Friday and due on Tuesday every week.
- Reading should be done every day for at least 20 minutes and recorded in reading diaries.
- Spellings will be recorded in spelling books for practice at home.
- Knowledge organisers shared detailing what will be covered in-school.




Please support your child with their learning at home; homework must be completed every week.

SATs (Standard Assessment Tests)

The 2026 Key Stage 2 SATs will take place in the week commencing **Monday 11th May 2026.**

- Spelling
- Punctuation and Grammar (45 minutes)
- Reading Paper (1 hour)
- Paper 1: Maths Arithmetic (30 minutes)
- Paper 2: Maths Reasoning (40 minutes)
- Paper 3: Maths Reasoning (40 minutes)
