Our Ambition






Grange's Mobile Library - £1,000 Budget Breakdown










1. Do you enjoy reading?



What kinds of books do you like to read?

Children enjoy reading lots of different types of books! Many said they like **funny books**, especially **comics** and **diary-style books** like *Dork Diaries*, *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*, and *Dog Man*. **Poems** and **short funny stories** are also popular.


A lot of children love **action**, **adventure**, and **fantasy** books. Popular choices include *Harry Potter*, *The Lord of the Rings*, and books by **David Walliams**, **Michael Morpurgo**, and *Louis Sachar. Some also enjoy **science books**, **history books**, and **football books**.

Manga and anime-style books, like Blue Lock, were mentioned too. Other favourites include mystery, romance, and horror stories such as Goosebumps.

Many children enjoy **fiction books**, especially ones with interesting characters, villains, and exciting plots. Some even said they enjoy **modest**, **long stories**, or will give **any book** a try if it's interesting or fun!


4. Do you have a quiet or comfy place to read at school?




5. Would you like more chances to read outside?





6. Would you use a mobile library if we had one at school? 110 responses

Children would love a mobile library that is not only filled with a range of books (especially comics) but also offers a comfortable and inviting space with cushions, beanbags, and a dedicated area to draw and write.

There are lots of fun and useful things we would love to have in the mobile library to make it even better.


Some of us would like a **roof or shaded area**, so we can read peacefully without the sun in our eyes. A **mini tent**, **shade**, or even a **cooling station** would be great for hot days. It would also be lovely to have **mats**, **comfy chairs**, or even a **couch**, so we can relax and enjoy our books. Reading outside in the sunshine with a comfy spot would make the mobile library feel even more special.

We'd also love a **quiet and comfortable space** with different **sections for types of books**, like history books, sporty books, manga, and favourites like *Harry Potter*, *Dog Man*, *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*, *Dork Diaries*, and even *Shakespeare*! A **tablet or screen to help find books** would make it easier for everyone to explore.

Some children would like to have **snacks (with limits!)**, or fun extras like **art activities**, **poem writing**, **math games**, and even **book hunts**, where you tick off books you've found on a list. **Paintings and colours** could also make the space feel more welcoming and creative.

Most of all, we want the mobile library to be a place where everyone feels welcome to read, relax, and enjoy their time.


8. How would it feel to read outside or in a special reading cabin? 112 responses



The majority of pupils responded positively to the idea of reading outside or in a special reading cabin. Common feelings included:


- Relaxing frequently mentioned, suggesting a calm and peaceful reading environment.
- Interesting many children found the idea engaging and appealing.
- Exciting several pupils felt it would be a fun and different experience.
- "I'd love it!" this enthusiastic phrase appeared multiple times, showing strong interest and excitement.
- Only two children described it as boring, indicating an overwhelmingly positive overall response.

9. Would you like to visit the mobile library with a friend, class, or your family? 112 responses




10. Do you visit your local library outside of school? (Yes / No)

12. What could we do to help more children enjoy reading?

We can help more children enjoy reading by making it fun, exciting, and easy to do!

One idea is to have more places to find books, like a mobile library that visits our school every week. We could also have more chances to go to the school library — as long as we keep it tidy and quiet. Making the library cosy with beanbags, cushions, and cool decorations would make it a nice place to relax and read.

It would be great to have more books that children actually like, such as funny books, comics, and stories for all ages. We could even do a survey to find out what everyone's favourite authors and books are, so we can get more of them in the library.

We could have fun events like book fairs, reading workshops, and even reading challenges with prizes! Posters and short videos could help show why reading is important and how much fun it can be.

Reading doesn't always have to be done alone — someone could read to us with lots of expression to make the story come alive, or we could read to each other. Having quiet, comfy places to sit would also help us enjoy our books more.

Most of all, we should be allowed to choose the books we like and read them in a fun and friendly space. That way, more children will see that reading can be amazing!
