


Overview of the Report Purpose


Assembly, Workshop, and Combined Impact

Workshop Outcomes



Student Leadership Importance


Empowering our pupils through Community Engagement


Whole-School Assembly







What does 'The Power of Good' mean? 46 responses







5. Did the role play help you understand what to do if you see bullying? 43 responses




6. How did the assembly make you feel? 45 responses









Impact Highlights

Understanding and Engagement in Action

Strong Understanding

Pupils demonstrated a strong understanding of bullying concepts, recalling key messages about kindness and positive choices shared during the assembly, reinforcing the importance of speaking up.

High Engagement

The assembly created high engagement levels among pupils, who found peer-led presentations relatable and enjoyable, fostering a supportive environment for discussing anti-bullying initiatives.

Reinforced Culture

The event effectively reinforced our anti-bullying culture, prompting students to identify specific supportive actions and increasing demand for future student-led initiatives and leadership within the school.


Engaging Parent Workshop

Parent Feedback Summary

Question 1: What did you enjoy most about the workshop?

Parents particularly enjoyed seeing the pupils take the lead.

Many highlighted the children's confidence, openness, and active participation.

- Parents appreciated the presentations and answers shared by pupils.
- Several simply stated they enjoyed "everything" or "all" aspects of the workshop.
 Overall theme: Parents valued the pupil-led approach and the opportunity to see their children engage confidently.

Question 2: How could we improve future parent workshops?

Suggestions focused on adding variety and deeper engagement.

- More activities, role plays, and interactive elements were suggested.
- A few parents asked for more information, examples, and visuals (e.g., charts or short skits).
- Others encouraged continuing with the same engaging approach.
 Overall theme: Parents would like workshops to remain interactive and informative, with more examples and demonstrations.

Question 3: What ideas will you take away to support positive behaviour and kindness at home?

Parents identified practical takeaways and reflections.

- Emphasis on speaking kindly and modelling calm, positive behaviour.
- Commitment to having more discussions with children about kindness and school life.
- Use of provided leaflets as a resource for continuing conversations at home.
 Overall theme: Parents intend to reinforce positive communication, kindness, and reflection at home.

General summary:

Parents were highly positive about the workshop, praising the confidence and leadership shown by pupils. They appreciated the opportunity for parent-pupil interaction and expressed interest in attending more workshops like this, especially those with interactive and practical components.

Impact Outcomes

Parent Understanding and Engagement

Increased Understanding

100% of parents reported greater clarity on bullying definitions and the differences from friendship conflicts, leading to a more informed perspective on their children's experiences.
