### The Big Picture

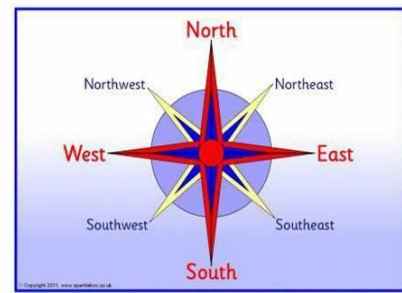
Children are able to explore their own local area and establish where it fits in London. They will understand that London is the Capital of the UK and where it fits into the world.

| Human Feature    | Something created by people (e.g. houses).  |
| Physical Feature | Something that occurs naturally (e.g. a river)  |
| Amenities        | Something which is built to make life more comfortable or pleasant for people in a town or city. City |
| City Centre      | The middle of a city. Normally where all of the shops are.  |
| Aerial View      | The view you get when you look down on something from above   |
| Location         | Where something is found.   |
| Transport        | Something which helps people get to and from another place.   |
| Key              | A set of symbols you find on a map.   |
| Tourist          | Somebody who visits a place to enjoy it.  |

**Roads-** to allow people to get to Harrow

**Railway-** to allow people to get to Harrow and from Harrow to London

**Houses-** for people to live in Schools- for children to learn







**Shops-** for people to buy food and other things they need
