

The Big Picture		
<p>'The Rainbow Fish' is the story of a beautiful, colourful fish with shiny scales that lives in the sea. Rainbow Fish loves his scales so much that he does not want to share them with the other fish. A little blue fish is hurt by Rainbow Fish's rude attitude and refusal to share that he does not want to play with him and neither do the other fish. This is a story about learning to share and be kind. The children will practise listening to, discussing and expressing views about a story that is beyond the level they can read independently, taking turns to listen to others. We will be focusing on non-fiction writing, thinking of facts about fish that live in the sea. The children will practise writing sentences about the sea and fish living there.</p>		
Enquiry Questions		
<p>What can you see? What do you think is going to happen in this story? How do you think the Rainbow Fish felt in this part of the story? What would you do in this situation? Can you think of some adjectives to describe life under the sea? What do you know about fish and how they move in the water? Have you heard of the words 'non-fiction' before? What does 'non-fiction' mean?</p>
